

Salvia involucrata

Roseleaf Sage



PLANT DESCRIPTION

Plant Type:	Perennial
Height / Width:	5-6 ft. H x 5-6 ft. W
Plant Form:	Shrubby, upright, branching Fast-growing
Flower / Fruit:	Beautiful "rosebuds" open to clusters of large, magenta flowers on long stems, from mid-summer through fall
Leaf Color, Size:	Lush, rich green, velvety leaves with purple undersides and ribs
Native To:	Eastern Mexico

GROWING REQUIREMENTS

Sunset Zones:	8-24
Soil:	Well-drained, amended, rich
Water:	Moderate to regular (may need staking with more water)
Sun:	Full sun, but does best in afternoon shade
Care and Pruning:	Deadhead regularly to keep stems erect. Prune in winter.
