PLANT DESCRIPTION

Plant Type:	Herbaceous perennial
Height / Width:	1.5 ft. H x 1 ft. W
Plant Form:	Upright
Flower / Fruit:	Whorls of 1-in.-long lavender blue flowers in upright spikes, in spring to mid-summer
Leaf Color, Size:	Lyre-shaped basal leaves
Native To:	Eastern and southwest U.S.

GROWING REQUIREMENTS

Sunset Zones:	1-9
Soil:	Prefers moist, sandy or clay soils, well-drained
Water:	Medium to wet
Sun:	Full sun to partial shade
Care and Pruning:	Self-seeds and naturalizes in optimum conditions

GARDEN USE

Borders, cottage gardens, wild or naturalized plantings. Moist areas in low spots or along streams or ponds. Attracts bees and butterflies.
